MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE WHEATFIELD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES INGHAM COUNTY, MICHIGAN

Supervisor Myer called meeting to order at 7:00PM.

Roll call—Allen, Henley, Kapp, Miller and Myer-present.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment: Opened at 7:02 PM. Three people spoke-the comments were regarding the zoning ordinance amendment about Wind Energy Systems. Closed at 7:10 PM.

MINUTES:

Motion by Henley to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of November 14, 2023, seconded by Allen.

All were in favor. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Given by Miller. Summary as of November 30, 2023:

- ✓ Cemetery Certificate of Deposit:-----\$ 7,200.00

Motion by Allen to approve the treasurer's report of November 30, 2023, seconded by Henley.

All were in favor. Motion carried.

- ✓ The winter tax season is underway.
- ✓ Board consensus was to place another \$100,000 into a longer-term Certificate of Deposit. Holly will research this and report back to the board.

PLANNING COMMISSION: Given by Kapp.

- ✓ Mark Eidelson attended the November 30th meeting. His professional opinion was that the planning commission should recommend the Wind Energy amendment to the board so that we have regulations in place for clean energy systems less than 100MW for wind developments and 50MW for solar developments, and also to cover the time between now and when the new legislation goes into effect on November 30, 2024.
- ✓ One minor change was made regarding shadow flicker. The amendment was recommended by the planning commission unanimously for approval to the board of trustees with this change. The amendment is on the agenda this evening under discussion.

*****DISCUSSION ITEMS****

1. Wind Energy systems Amendment. Tonight's packet includes the latest draft of the Wind Energy Systems amendment, dated December 1, 2023. The minutes of the October 11th public hearing is included. PC Chair Mike Kapp passed out "Comments to the Board of Trustees Regarding the Planning Commission's Recommendation of Wind Energy System Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance." Mike gave a summary of the amendment, starting with the 3-year history of the planning commission's extensive study and work on the amendment and the many revisions that were made along the way due to feedback from residents. Discussion by the board included setbacks, vibrations, and roads. This amendment will not cover large developments as the State has pre-empted local control over those. The planning commission unanimously recommends approval of the amendment by the board of trustees. This will be a discussion item for next month.

*****ACTION ITEMS****

1. Accounts Payable for November 2023 (Payroll and Expenses).

*The invoice from ICRD is less than expected due to overall costs being lower and because only one course of chip seal was laid on Apple Blossom as an experiment in longevity by the ICRD.

Motion by Allen to approve the accounts payable for November 2023 as presented, seconded by Henley.

Roll call vote: Allen, Henley, Kapp, Miller and Myer-yes. Motion carried. *Payroll and list of expenses attached.

Motion to adjourn by Henley, seconded by Allen. All were in favor—motion carried. Miller absent.
